MEDICAID SERVICES

MEDICAID FUNDING IS PROHIBITED IN AL & PCH HOMES

Current laws prohibit Medicaid funding to residents in Assisted Living and large Personal Care Home facilities.





MEDICAID ELIGIBLE LOW-INCOME SENIORS NEED SERVICES

These laws deprive Medicaid eligible low-income seniors of support services if they relocate to assisted living homes.
